



The area surrounding Herzberg, located in the Aargau Jura region, features unique habitats: dry meadows, hedgerows, and rough pastures. This diverse landscape is rich in species and home to a wide variety of plants and animals, including some rare and endangered species. With the help of your team, valuable habitats can be preserved, and biodiversity can be supported.



## **Crafting for Local Biodiversity in Frutigen**

The "Little Nepal" farm, managed by Andreas Weber and his team, serves as a place for people to explore simple and sustainable living. Various measures are implemented on the farm to protect nature.

One major threat to native biodiversity is the intensive use and fertilization of meadows, which has drastically reduced insect populations. This decline affects not only wild bees but also many bird species that rely on a diverse insect population. We build nesting and feeding stations tailored to the needs of these species, making a valuable contribution to supporting their populations. Look forward to a varied activity where every member of your team can work at their own pace.

## **Landscape Maintenance at Griesalp**

The Griesalp, nestled in the Jungfrau-Aletsch UNESCO World Heritage Site, presents itself as a fascinating region with impressive biodiversity. To preserve this diversity, various measures are necessary. By removing small trees and bushes, the "overgrowth" of pastures is prevented to preserve the diversity of flower species.

The branches are used and stacked as branch piles to provide a habitat for various small animals. Working and learning something new together in the special setting of the Griesalp makes the experience a holistic and enriching day in which the environment is supported, and team spirit is strengthened.

## **Supporting Sustainable Agriculture**


The "Grüezi Garte" farm in Zug practices near-natural organic regenerative agriculture according to the principles of permaculture. The topic of renaturation is a central element of the farm. The aim here is to create diverse habitats for small animals. After a tour of the farm, during which you will expand your knowledge of sustainable and solidarity-based farming, we will get to work. Among other things, we build piles of stones and branches for reptiles and weasels. We also discover the large vegetable garden and harvest part of our lunch here ourselves. This activity gives you and your team an insight into an organically managed farm and promotes local biodiversity.

## **Glaubenberg: Fascination Peatlands**

Peatlands are unique landscapes. Although they only cover just under three percent of the earth's surface today, they store twice as much carbon as all the world's forests combined. The Glaubenberg moorland is the last large contiguous moor in Switzerland and is an important habitat for a wide variety of animal and plant species. For example, the endangered capercaillie and the sundew, a carnivorous plant, live here. Together with your team, you will help to clear the moorland of bushes and restore its original character. In this way, the habitat for the typical moorland species will continue to exist. You will also gain an intensive insight into this special landscape.

- We maintain and clear the peatlands
- · We remove felled wood and cuttings
- We learn exciting facts about the moor and the local flora and fauna



## Thurgau - Camel Farm Olmerswil

The camel farm Olmerswil in Neukirch an der Thur is a formerly conventionally run farm that has been transformed into a unique experience farm. Ecologically valuable structures are preserved, promoted, and newly created across the entire area. As a result, many precious habitats for native species have been established. Help maintain these habitats through landscape care and, in the process, get to know the extraordinary animal residents of the farm. The main project for this season is to create an educational nature trail, thereby promoting local environmental education.





## Work in the Vaud Alps

The Vaud Alps are one of the hotspots for biodiversity in the Alpine region. Numerous different species live here that have adapted perfectly to their habitat. However, the local flora and fauna are threatened by the scrub encroachment of alpine pastures and the spread of invasive plants. During our missions, in cooperation with the organization "Alpes vivantes", you help to maintain the alpine pastures and thus preserve this sensitive habitat.

## **Balsthal - Thal Nature Park**

Thal Nature Park is embedded in the mountain ranges of the Solothurn Jura, situated between Weissenstein and Wasserfallen in the catchment area of Basel. Bern, and Zurich. Over decades, the landscape has undergone changes, with an increasing loss of small structures and the destruction of habitats and shelters for many animals. The two native species of weasels (stoat and mouse weasel), being the smallest predators in Switzerland, depend on such structures, just like many other animals.

Join us in building these small structures and, in the process, learn fascinating facts about the animals and the entire ecosystem. Your involvement will make a significant contribution to the preservation of these species.





## **Organic Farming at the Dorna Farm**

In the municipality of Ausserberg, Regula Leutenegger and Peter Meierhans run the Dorna organic farm, where they cultivate around three quarters of the land as a biodiversity promotion area with extensive agriculture. The area with its Mediterranean temperatures is characterized by dry meadows, which are among the most species-rich habitats in Switzerland. The keeping of goats and dwarf zebus helps to promote biodiversity in the dry meadows. During the deployment, you will assist Regula and Peter in building a wolf-proof pasture fence for livestock protection and the preservation of the valuable landscape.



## **Active Seminar «Bats»**

Contribute to the preservation our native bats! Our active seminar differs from other NaturAktiv activities in that the practical nature work is supplemented by in-depth theoretical input. First, we work together to promote insects and beetles, the main source of food for these mysterious mammals. Then, together with a bat expert, we get to know these fascinating animals. We ask ourselves the following questions: How many bats are there in Switzerland? What do they eat? How do they help us and how can we help them? After this theoretical part, it slowly begins to darken. Now, equipped with an ultrasound device, we are going on a night safari! With a bit of luck, we will see the nocturnal hunters catching their prey and listen to them hunting.





## **Biodiversity hotspot in the city**

Cities are very interesting in terms of biodiversity. Compared to intensively used agricultural land, species diversity in urban areas is sometimes significantly higher. One example of this is the Allmend Stettbach: a piece of wild nature in the Zurich agglomeration, created from the excavation of the railway tunnel. Numerous plant species with special requirements can be found here. They need lots of sun and warmth, as well as dry and nutrient-poor soil. Therefore, regular maintenance is necessary to preserve this ecological habitat. Thanks to our care, the Allmend Stettbach is recognized as a biodiversity hotspot. Biologists have documented the presence of rare orchids, herbs, butterflies, snails, and many other species. Join us and spend an active day in the dry steppe!







## **Team up to clean Swiss river banks**

Switzerland is known as the land of rivers and lakes. However, the "Swiss Litter Report" shows that many shorelines are littered with waste. Approximately 14,000 tons of plastics enter soils and waterways every year. Littering poses a threat to animals and humans, as well as being a waste of resources. Annual cleanup costs amount to 200 million CHF.\*
